Part B

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution

The motto of this premier institution is "Saa Vidya Yaa Vimuktayea" meaning "That alone is knowledge which liberates" which implies liberating the suppressed sections of the society from the evil clutches of communalism, casteism and ignorance through education and helping them to lead an economically independent and decent life in the society. These objectives were fulfilled to a greater extent by admitting **666** Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students and **861** Backward Class and Most Backward Class students out of the total **1666** students of the College in the Aided Courses and **388** Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students and **787** Backward Class and Most Backward Class students out of the total **1192** students in the Un-Aided Courses.

UGC's approved scheme of coaching classes for SC/ST students appearing for NET examination, coaching classes for entry into services for SC/ST students and Remedial coaching classes for SC/ST students were continued this year (2011-2012) too.

There are 14 physically challenged students studying in the college. Ramps & Rails have been constructed in all the buildings to facilitate their easy movement. Lift facility was also established in Jawaharlal Nehru Block for the benefit of the physically challenged students.

2. New academic Programmes initiated (UG and PG)

- ❖ M.Sc. Biotechnology was introduced this year.
- ❖ UGC sponsored Diploma in Fabrication Engineering was introduced.
- ❖ Diploma in Factory Management was also introduced as an Un-Aided Programme.

3. Innovations in Curricular Design and Transaction

As per the guidelines of UGC, Choice Based Credit System which was introduced in the academic year 2005-2006 is continued with this year (2011-2012) also. In the Choice Based Credit System, a course on Value Based Education, 3 courses on Skill Based Education and two non-major elective courses have been introduced for all the UG Students.

The Tutor-Ward system is continued. Under this system, a staff member is made in-charge for each class. He / She continuously watches the performance of the students and gives them counselling. The staff members have been asked to remain in the staff

rooms for half an hour after the college work gets over. 5 students of the class meet him or her in the staff room every day. The staff gives them counselling regarding attendance, submission of assignment and performance in CIA tests. By this way all the students meet him / her in course of time and the cycle continues.

A Group namely **Core Group** was formed consisting of a few meritorious students from each class. A Series of Lecture programmes were organised for the group through out the year.

4. Inter disciplinary Programmes started

In all the UG Programmes two Non-Major Courses are offered to the students.

5. Examination reforms implemented

Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) system which was introduced as a part of CBCS pattern to all Under Graduate courses from the year 2005-2006 continues this year also. Students have to write two CIA tests and to submit 3 Assignments in a semester for each paper.

Students who have failed in only one subject at the end of the degree programme are allowed to appear for instant examination conducted within a month from the date of publication of results.

Transparency in valuation is provided to the students. A student can get a copy of his valued answer script, so that he can decide about the revaluation of the paper.

As the College was conferred Autonomous Status in 2010 Examinations for the I UG, II UG, I PG & II PG were conducted by the Office of the Controller of Examinations of the College. Submission of Examinations Application forms, issue of Hall Tickets and publication of Results were made through internet for the students of the Autonomous Pattern.

Consolidated Mark Statements with the photograph of the students were issued to the PG students who completed the programme.

The entire administration of the college including the activities of various Departments, has been computerized. Since the College became an Autonomous institution from the year 2010, the submission of Examination application, issue of Hall tickets and publication of Results were carried out through internet. Transfer Certificate, Attendance Certificate, Course Certificate and other certificates are issued using the computerized data bank. A touch screen facility would shortly be installed in the office for the benefit of students to collect the details about Admission, Fees, Examination etc.

26. Increase in the infrastructural facilities

- ❖ A computer Laboratory with 50 computers has been established in the Department of Geology.
- ❖ A common Instrumentation facility is being established in the Science Block with many sophisticated analytical equipment. We can boast of having some of the rare equipment available only in our College in this region.
- ❖ A block containing 80 class rooms and a Women's Hostel are under construction. Saranathan Block will be modified to house the Library. Boys Hostel is under renovation. All these buildings will be ready for use in 2012-2013.
- ❖ 4 Water Coolers have been installed at various places in the College.

27. Technology upgradation

The Laboratories established with DST-FIST support in the Department of Botany, Chemistry and Geology are fully utilized for conducting research. The laboratories are not only used by the staff of the College but also by the faculties of the Colleges in and around Tiruchirapalli.

All the Departments have computers. Physics, Chemistry, Geology and Mathematics departments have exclusive computer laboratories. The college has three common Computer Laboratories with a total of 250 systems for the use of students of BCA and B.Sc Computer science. Internet facility has been provided to all the Departments, including Library, College Office and all the HODs' rooms. There is a exclusive Data Processing Centre with 12 Computers, Scanners, Printers and Photo copiers adjoining the College office for the use of staff and students.

Under the Govt. of Tamilnadu scheme all the students of III UG programme were given Free Laptops. 802 Laptops were distributed.

A free Medical Centre was established in the College in the year 2009-2010. It continues to function this year too. Dr. R.Soundarraaj, MBBS is the resident Doctor for the centre and he treats the patients twice a week.

33. Performance in sports activities

93rd Annual Sports Day of our College was held on 27-02-2012. **Shri. C. Samual Chelliah, Youth Officer & Head, NSS Regional Center, Thiruvananthapuram, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt. of India** was the Chief Guest.

Our College Cricket Team has moved up from II to I Division and Football Team moved up from II to I Division.

On 22-07-2011, an interactive session was arranged by the department with the cricket legend Sri Krishnamachari Srikanth, former captain, Indian cricket team and member BCCI. Students were given guidance and motivation to remain resolutely focused on the career.

Bharathidasan University, Tiruchirapalli has given affiliation to the department to conduct Research leading to Ph.D. Degree.

“National College Sports Academy” has been instituted in the campus to give adequate training in Sports and games for the interested and potential School and College students of this region. The Academy focuses on Cricket, football, athletics and martial arts like Kung-foo / Teak-kwondo.

The Department organized an intercollegiate staff Cricket tournament. 20 Colleges participated in the Tournament. Our College won the title by defeating teams from Saranathan college of Engineering, MAM college of Engineering, Rover college of Arts and science and St.Joseph College.

Student’s Individual Performance

A general knowledge test was conducted by Dr. Sunitha.S, Associate Professor, Department of Chemistry on February, 2nd, 2012. The college quiz club was inaugurated on February 29, 2012.

programs are organized for the benefit of the students free of cost. The cell organized an awareness programme on Campus Placements on 20-21 July 2011.

Functioning of the Placement Cell- A Brief Note

The placement cell organizes motivation and training programs for the benefit of the students free of cost. The students are advised to have active e-mail addresses and contact numbers to keep them prepared for the modern interview practices. Before the recruitment programs, they are given training in which they are briefed about the nature of tests, CV writing methods and mock interview practices. Competitive examination oriented books are made available in the college library and the students are directed to make use of this facility.
