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NATIONAL COLLEGE

- A SKETCH

National College, Trichinopoly was founded on 11th June 1919, due to Diwan Bahadur S.Rm. Ct. Pethachi Chettiar, Zamindar of Andipatti and the collective initiative and zeal of eminent personalities Justice T.V. Seshagiri Iyer, Sir. T. Desikachariar, Sri. N. D. Subbarama Iyer and Sri. S. Sivaramakrishna Iyer. The college has its origin in the National High School founded on 11th June 1886.

The founders conceived the idea of a National Institution to promote among the youth, the loftiest ideals that constitute the essence of Indian culture and nationalism. True to its name, National College continues to impart cultural values and fulfill its role as one of the country's premiere nation-building institutions. Under the stewardship of eminent scholars and administrators as its principals and secretaries, the college has become a seat for higher education and has earned a reputation for its high education standards.

The college operated on the Teppakkulam campus for nearly four decades, starting in 1919. On July 8, 1959, the college started functioning from the present new campus, close to the railway junction on the Tiruchirappalli-Dingdigul Highway.

The college celebrated its golden jubilee in 1959.

The National Evening College emerged in 1978 to cater to the needs of employed youth who wanted to improve their knowledge base.

The Diamond Jubilee of the College was celebrated in the years 1980-81 under the presidency of Hon'ble Shri R. Venkataraman, the most distinguished alumnus, the then Minister of Finance, Government of India, who later became the President of India.

The Platinum Jubilee was celebrated in 1995, and the celebrations were presided over by Dr. V.R. Muthukaruppan, the then Vice-Chancellor of Bharathidasan University, Tiruchirappalli.

The 'Evening College' transitioned to the 'Unaided Programmes' in the academic year 2005-06. The 'aided programs' and the 'unaided programs' coexist.

The college introduced a co-education pattern in the academic year 2007 to fulfill its social commitment to the education of girls in the area of higher education.

The college offers seventeen postgraduate and twenty-seven undergraduate programs, apart from job-oriented programs. Fifteen departments offer the facility to register for doctoral degree programs. The staff members vie with each other to produce quality research publications.

The establishment of the National College Instrumentation Facility (NCIF) in 2012, which is one of its kind in this part of the country, is one of the examples of the provision of adequate infrastructure for high-end research by the college. This supports a wide spectrum of researchers in science, across the country.

The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), accredited the college at 'A' level in the first cycle (2005) and 'A+' in the third cycle (2016). The University Grants Commission (UGC) conferred "Autonomous" status in 2010 and conferred the privilege of "College with Potential for Excellence" status in 2011. The MHRD, Government of India, has identified the College for Study in India (SII) Programme, to admit foreign students in various academic programs.

After the trifurcation of the National College Council in 2004, the newly named "Academy of Higher Education", under whose jurisdiction the National College and Sesha Iyengar Memorial Higher Secondary School came, saw a turning point in all aspects. New courses were introduced, and the college's strength also greatly improved under the dynamic leadership of Shri. N. N. Seshadri as President and Shri. K. Ragnathan as secretary.

In 2010, Padmavibushan Dr. V. Krishnamurthy assumed office as the President of the Educational Agency and the College Committee. It was the beginning of the Renaissance for the college. The college underwent massive infrastructure developments, including the construction of a new class room block with 48 rooms, a girls hostel that could accommodate over 300 students, both indoor and outdoor sports stadiums, a library building, an amphitheater, a gym, and a yoga hall. To commemorate the centenary, the college constructed a grand new, imposing entrance and an open-air auditorium. The college's atmosphere underwent a significant transformation with the addition of fountains and lush greenery. He was also responsible for starting Rajam Krishnamurthy Public School, a new CBSE school, in the year 2019.

Recognizing the contribution of Dr. V. Krishnamurthy to the college, the members of the managing agency renamed it as "Dr. V. Krishnamurthy Educational Foundation" in 2017. At present, the Dr. V. Krishnamurthy Educational Foundation manages the college along with two schools: "Sesha Iyengar Memorial Higher Secondary School", situated in the ancient historic town of Woraiyur, Tiruchirappalli, and the "Rajam

Krishnamurthy Public School (CBSE) - (RKPS)", which is situated opposite to the College Campus, abutting the Boys' Hostel. Empowered with the latest state-of-the-art technology, the RKPS provides an uncompromising and high-quality school education.

The College celebrated the Centenary Year with all grandeur under the presidency of Dr. V. Krishnamurthy in 2019. The celebration comprised a number of events and spanned the whole academic year 2019–2020. The Hon'ble Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu, the Vice President of India (2017–2022), inaugurated the Centenary Celebrations on January 10, 2020. It was a memorable momentousness and a once-in-a-lifetime event for students, staff, and the hundreds of alumni and retired staff, who were present on the occasion.

After the demise of President Dr. V. Krishnamurthy in 2022, the college is now managed by a committee consisting of fourteen members, with Sri. Jayakar Krishnamurthy as its president and Sri K. Raghunathan as its secretary. The college has around 269 faculty members, 93 supporting staff, and about 4300 students on the rolls.

With the wholehearted commitment of the management, who brings together world class facilities and brains to infuse the young minds with ethics, human values, and environmental consciousness, and the efforts of the employees and the inquisitive students, the college shall reach greater heights in the forthcoming years. The management is keen on ensuring that children receive a wholesome education from the pre-KG class until the completion of their doctorate degree under the auspicious of "Dr. V. Krishnamurthy Educational Foundation".

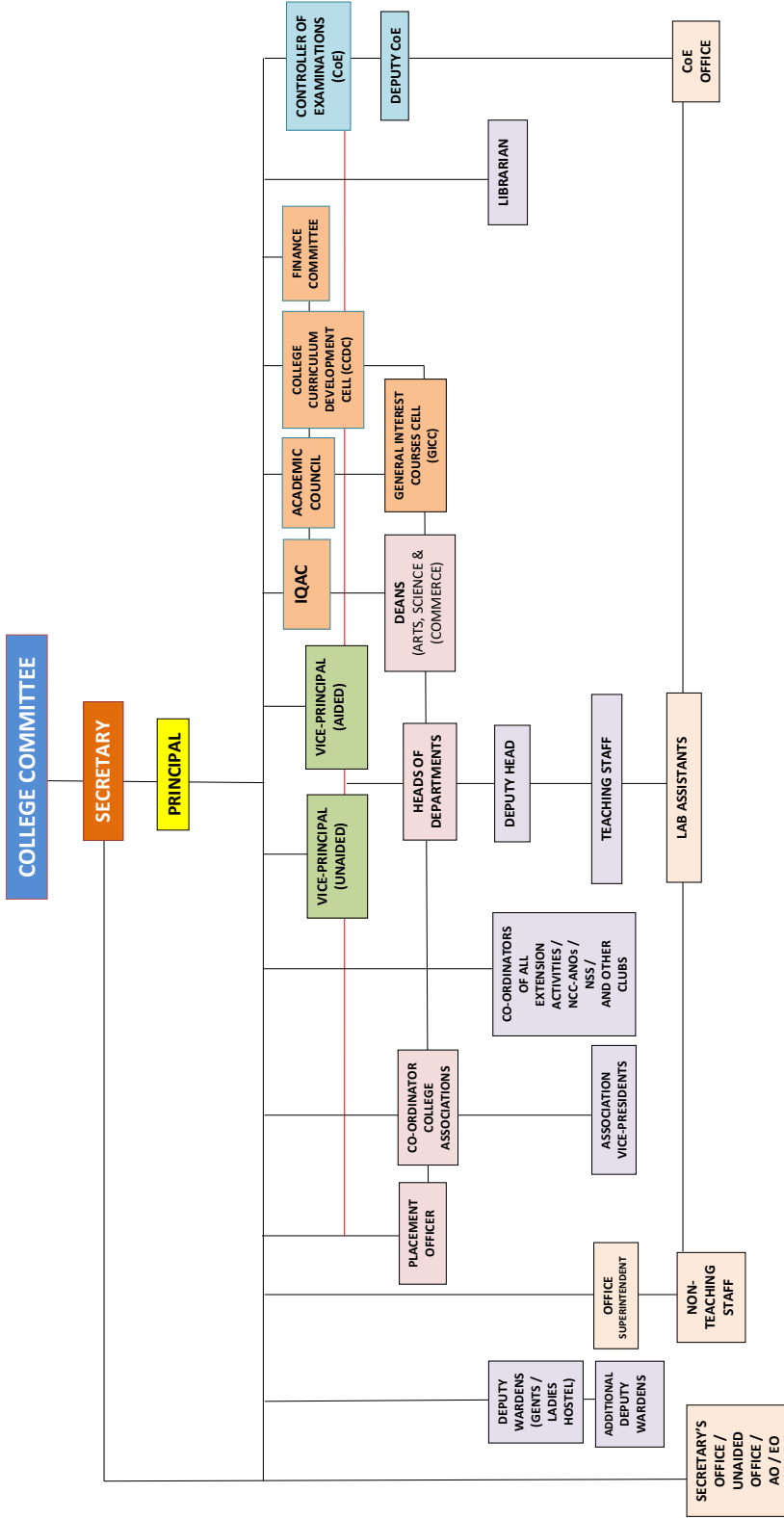

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- ∞ Students should follow strict timings for the class hours and laboratory sessions as per the given time table.

The College Timings:

First Shift: 8.30 a.m. - 1.20 p.m. (Interval: 11.15 a.m. - 11.30 a.m.)

Second Shift : 1.40 p.m. - 5.50 p.m. (Interval: 4.00 p.m. - 4.15 p.m.)

- ∞ The students should reach the college in time and be punctual in all academic related activities.
- ∞ Every student should wear his / her Identity Card along with tag inside the College campus and produce it on demand by the authorities.
- ∞ Every day starts with “College Prayer”. During the prayer song, everybody should give due respect and remain standing silence till the end wherever they are.
- ∞ Altering, improperly possessing, or lending the Institute identification card to another person for any reason is not permitted.
- ∞ Students are expected to come to the college in neat, clean and simple clothes. They must conform to the high standards of modesty maintained by the institutions. They should not wear gaudy dresses or ‘T’ shirts.
- ∞ Women students are strictly not permitted to wear skirts, frocks and high tops.
- ∞ Students should be regular and punctual in attending the classes and all activities connected with the college. No student is allowed to enter the classroom or leave the class room during class hours without the permission of the Professor concerned/the HoD/the Principal.
- ∞ Each and every class will have a tutor. Students are instructed to approach their tutors for their academic needs.
- ∞ Students should obey the Rules and Regulations of our College. Students should not bring discredit to the college or to themselves. Insubordination and rude behaviour of any kind inside or outside the college will be severely dealt with.
- ∞ Students are expected to take care of the college property and help in keeping the premises neat and clean. Disfiguring of walls, doors or breaking the furniture is a breach of discipline and will not be tolerated.
- ∞ Students are forbidden from organizing any meeting in the college premises or collecting money for any purpose without the permission of the principal.
- ∞ Students are not permitted to entertain the visitors in the college during the working hours. They are strictly forbidden from receiving personal phone calls or letters.

- ∞ CIA I and CIA II are part of curriculum and student should be sincere in taking these tests. They should not indulge in any kind of malpractice during examinations or tests.
- ∞ Eve-teasing is strictly prohibited & eve-teasers will be dismissed from the college. According to Tamil Nadu eve-teasing ordinance of 1998 whoever commits or participated or abets in eve-teasing, in or within the premises of any educational institutions, is liable for imprisonment for term which may extend to one year or shall be liable to a fine which may extend to Rs.10,000/- or both.
- ∞ Ragging in any form inside or outside the college campus and hostel is banned. Senior students found indulging in ragging junior students will be dismissed from the institution.
- ∞ According to guidelines provided by U.G.C. and university, students found guilty of participation or abetment in ragging will be subject to severe punishment ranging from cancellation of admission to a fine up to Rs.25,000 and rigorous imprisonment up to 3 years.
- ∞ Any unhealthy relationship between students that might affect their academic performance, breach their personal space or affect the reputation of the institution will be strictly dealt with.
- ∞ Students coming by two wheelers are instructed to wear helmet. They should possess a valid driving license. The vehicle must be parked in the allotted space only.
- ∞ Smoking as well as consuming of intoxicants are strictly prohibited within the premises of the campus/ hostel and while representing the Institution. The College campus is a no-smoking/ alcohol-free zone.
- ∞ Loitering in the hallways during the class hours can disrupt learning for other students. Hence, it is better be avoided.
- ∞ During the class hours students are not permitted to patronage any students from the class in the name of co-curricular/extra-curricular/sports activities, without the permission of the Principal.
- ∞ Being an eco-friendly campus, plastic or other trash should not be thrown inside the college or in the premises. All are directed to maintain the hygiene of the campus.
- ∞ Students should keep themselves informed of the instructions issued to them from time to time orally or through notices/ circulars and emails.
- ∞ If there is any change in the address, contact number and email ID, students should inform to the tutor concerned, HoD and the college office.
- ∞ Students must abide by the rules and regulations in force as well as other rules prescribed by the college from time to time. Thus, in the interest of the students, strict discipline has become the watch word of the college.

- ∞ Students who do not follow the college rules and regulations will be expelled from the college.
- ∞ The Principal shall be the final authority in the interpretation of the College rules. Matters not covered by these rules are left to the discretion of the Principal and his decision shall be final.

- ∞ Parents are reminded that they are not absolved of their responsibility in the education of their children once their daughters/sons are admitted to the college. They should follow the students' progress in studies and her/his general conduct in and outside the college. Their co-operation is solicited especially to ensure regular attendance of classes.
- ∞ Apollo Medical Centre (Apollo Shines) is available in the campus for students. For consultation/emergency treatment anybody can make use of the facility.

WARNING

- ∞ The Government has authorised the Principal to penalise, suspend or dismiss any student who is found guilty of gross misconduct inside the College / Hostel premises or even outside the College campus.



ACADEMIC INFORMATION

1. TUITION FEE

The Tuition fee is to be paid in one installment for each semester. The tenth working day of the semester is the last date to pay the fee without fine. An additional fee of Rs.50/- with a fine of Rs.10/- per day of delay is to be paid before the 30th working day, for the payment of the tuition fee with fine (vide. Paragraph No.3, also). The names are liable to be struck of the rolls, after that. On the discretion of the Principal, the student may be re-admitted by the payment of full fees, with re-admission fee and late fee, as per the norms. Absence from the college, with or without the sanction of the Principal, shall not be deemed as an excuse for not paying the fees, before the stipulated period.

The required percentage in attendance is one of the essential criteria for applying/sanctioning/renewal of the scholarship, apart from an excellent scoring at the previous level of study (+2 /Degree). A few more scholarships are also made available from time to time. Students are to get updated by carefully perceiving the notice board, and the circulars/announcements from the Principal or other.

3. ATTENDANCE

Attendance is marked at the advent of every hour. Students coming late may not be marked attendance for that hour. Also, those who are not inside the classroom/lab may not be marked the attendance. They have to seek the permission of the concerned Class Teacher and the Head of the Department, which will ultimately be sanctioned only by the Principal. The students are to apply for leave of absence, much earlier, to avoid embarrassment (vide. Rules, Regulations and Instructions). Absence for more than six working days may cause the name to be struck off the rolls. They may be re-admitted, at the discretion of the Principal. Abstaining from the periodical tests/examinations would tell upon the attendance and internal assessment. Only those who have 75% or more of the

total attendance will be permitted to appear for the Semester Examinations. And Attendance Certificates are issued only to those who have proven integrity. Any appeal for exemption from the production of Attendance Certificate is considered, if only the Principal is convinced about the fact that the lapse is beyond the control of the student. The number of working days per semester is not less than 90 days. Hence the students are advised to secure 75% of attendance, in each course, in which he/she is going to appear for the examination. Those who fail to do so, would have to re-do the concerned course and/or semester(s), after the completion of the whole programme.

In other words, students having shortage of attendance in the First Semester won't be permitted to sit for the Semester II. They have to re-do Semester I with a minimum attendance and then proceed to the Semester II.

4. SYLLABUS / CURRICULUM

The Syllabi of all the programmes are to be downloaded from the college website www.nct.ac.in. Browse this website and receive regular updates about the college and the important linked websites and make use of the facilities available through the 'student portal'.

5. ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES

Students willing to obtain Course/Transfer Certificate are to apply in the prescribed form, paying the prescribed fee. The office of the Principal would issue them, after verifying the necessary documents. Students are to apply to the Bharathidasan University to obtain Provisional Certificate and Migration Certificate, etc., through the Principal's office.

6. COLLEGE ASSOCIATIONS / CLUBS / FORUMS

The students shall choose one or more college forums/associations in the College. They provide opportunities to improve individual skills, hidden in oneself. The co-curricular and extra-curricular activities help to boost the self-esteem, inculcate group discipline and identify the fields of knowledge, suited to their taste. The Principal is the Ex-officio President of each of the Departmental Associations. A teacher is nominated as its Vice President. The details of various associations and staff-in-charge are to be found in the handbook under the head, the Academic Committees. Make an inquiry with the staff-in-charge of the concerned Department.

7. CORE GROUP

Outstanding students from every class across all disciplines are chosen to form the intellectual elite, in the college, named as the Core Group. Experts from different walks of life are invited to interact with them. This facilitates them to learn across and beyond various disciplines of study which develops them to excel in the competitive examinations and job market.

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS) & OUTCOME BASED EDUCATION (OBE)

All the programmes offered by the College come under CBCS and OBE. It helps the students to keep pace with the latest developments and trends in higher education in compliance with the assurance of quality in liberalisation and globalisation. This came into effect from the year 2005-06, as per the guidelines of the affiliating university. A restructured syllabus is introduced from the year 2010, as the college became autonomous, at all levels of U.G. and P.G. Programmes. The structure and syllabi are subjected to revision at least once in three years or as and when required.

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has initiated the mission of improving the quality of higher education in India through its Quality Mandate in the year 2018. This aims to fill the gap in acquiring degree and attain the level of employability. Therefore, it took the drive for developing Learning Outcomes based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) under the international standards of Outcome Based Education (OBE).

Learning in this pattern, Bachelor's Degrees are awarded on the basis of demonstrated achievement of outcomes (expressed in terms of knowledge, understanding, skills, attitudes and values) and academic standards expected of graduates of a programme of study. Learning outcomes specify what exactly the graduates are expected to know after completing a particular programme of study, understand and capable of doing what they ascertain at the end of their programme of study. The expected learning outcomes are used as reference points that would help formulate graduate attributes, qualification descriptors, programme learning outcomes and course learning outcomes which, in turn will help in curriculum planning & development, and in the design, delivery and review of academic programmes. They provide general guidance for articulating the essential learning associated with programmes of study and courses within a programme.

Keeping in mind the approach of the UGC on LOCF and by its directions, our College, through its august Academic Council, decided to implement OBE in the curriculum from the academic year 2019-20 onwards.

CREDITS

The term 'Credit', refers to the weightage given to a course, usually in relation to the instructional hours and content of the course assigned to it. The total minimum credits, required for completing U.G. Programme, and PG Programmes are 120 and 90 respectively. Details of credits for individual components and individual courses are to be obtained from the programme structure / syllabus found in the college website.

Each course shall be designed variously under lectures/tutorials/ laboratory practical/ field work/ seminar/ practical training/ assignments/ term paper/ report writing, etc., to satisfy effective teaching-learning process.

*Mandatory: All those who opt for Language Hindi/Sanskrit, instead of Language Tamil must choose only Sirappu Tamil or Adippadai Tamil as the subject under Non-major Elective (NME). They are not permitted to opt for any other subject under NME, as per the orders of the Government of Tamil Nadu and the affiliating university.

#Offered only to the NCC Cadets

Conditions under which the student is to opt for Sirappu Tamil I and II

1. The student had studied Tamil in 10th Standard and/or 12th Standard and had opted for the Language French/Hindi/Sanskrit, instead of Tamil etc.
2. The student with mother tongue Tamil had studied Language French, Hindi, Sanskrit, etc., in the 10th Standard (OSLC/CBSE/AISC) and/or 12th Standard (TN State Board) and had opted for French/Hindi/ Sanskrit in the College.

Conditions under which the student is to opt for Adippadai Tamil I and II

1. The student is from outside the State of Tamil Nadu, whose mother tongue is NOT Tamil and/or who has not studied Tamil at any level.
2. The student is from Tamil Nadu, whose mother tongue is NOT Tamil and/or who has not studied Tamil at any level.
3. **If the students fail to identify this mandatory ruling, they will not qualify for the Degree.**

COURSES FOR EXTRA - CREDITS

The curriculum offers an innovative practice of scoring extra credits through self-study courses. The student may choose one or a maximum of two self-study courses. The students are to identify the courses from the given list. Classes won't be met for such courses. The general attendance is taken into account for the award of marks for attendance in the Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA). Apart from this, the tutor would evaluate the assignments and CIA tests, given to the students, periodically. The Marks Statement would carry the nomenclature of such courses and credits obtained, at the completion of the course/programme.

AUTONOMOUS EXAMINATIONS

- ∞ The candidates are to take the examinations at the end of each semester – October / November – for odd semesters and April / May – for even semesters.
- ∞ Those who are to reappear for the examination in any course, are permitted so, in the subsequent semesters to take the examinations as the arrear course.
- ∞ But if the candidate is to reappear for the practical examinations, he/ she is to take them with the Regular Practical examinations, as per the schedule.
- ∞ The candidates are to appear for the Viva-voce Examination, defending their Project.
- ∞ Oral examinations are a part of Communicative English Course and Practical Examinations in science subjects. They carry five marks each. In other words, the theory course carry a maximum of 70 marks and oral examinations carry 5 marks. Put together, it is 75 marks.

PREPARE YOURSELF FOR THE EXAMINATIONS

- ∞ Look for the important dates, announced by the Principal. Mark them in your Handbook. Stick to the schedule.
- ∞ Look at the notice board for your regularity in attendance. Candidates, who don't have 75% of the total attendance, are not permitted to sit for the examinations. However, you may, with 60% to 74% of attendance, condone the examinations, only on genuine reasons based on the Medical Certificate issued by the competent authority. If you have less than 60% of the attendance, you are not eligible for the examinations. You are to re-do the concerned semester/ semesters after the completion of the entire programme of study.
- ∞ Update the College office staff (Aided / Unaided) for Attendance, with your 'On duty' attendance certificates, well in advance. Late submission of attendance certificates would not be honored. Be an early bird. Seek the advice of your Tutor/Head of the Department.
- ∞ Do all your examination-related work by yourself. Don't designate this work to your friends or relatives. They may err.
- ∞ Pay all the fees due, to the college office or the online banking services, whichever the office demands. The application form for examination would open for you in the online-portal of the Controller of Examinations, if only these conditions are met with. Keep all the fee-receipts handy.
- ∞ If you are in the first semester, tick mark (✓) your Language Course (French/ Hindi/ Tamil/ Sanskrit) in the Examination application form, available online in the college website. Take a print-out and keep it for future reference. Don't forget.
- ∞ If you are in the other semesters, tick mark (✓) the courses you are going to appear, including the arrear courses, if any, in the application form, available online from the college website. Pay the fees for the arrear courses.

- ∞ The Principal shall announce the date for the release of the Hall Tickets. Visit the college website, follow the instructions therein, and take a print-out of the hall-ticket. Verify your photograph and other details therein. Your access to this portal is limited to a specific period, beyond which it will be closed. And those who fail to download and bring the print-out of the hall ticket to the examination, along with the identity card, are not permitted to appear for the examination. The Principal uses his discretion in solving the discrepancy, based on the supporting documents you produce, related to the issue.

THE DAY OF THE EXAMINATION

- ∞ Start early from your house / hostel / room / accommodation.
- ∞ Pack your bag with the Hall ticket, writing materials and adorn yourself with the Identity Card. Don't forget. Produce them when the invigilator demands. Entry into the hall without these two or either, forfeits your candidature.
- ∞ The examinations commence at 09.30 for the Forenoon Session and conclude at 12.30, afternoon. The commencement is at 2.00 for the afternoon session which concludes at 5.00 p.m. Enter the examination hall 10 minutes before the commencement of the examinations. Avoid arguments.
- ∞ Sit at the place designated to you, where your registration number is written.
- ∞ You are denied admission to examination, if you arrive late.
- ∞ You are to remain in the hall for the entire period of the examination.
- ∞ Take the signature of the invigilator on all your answer papers. Verify your register number in the attendance sheet. Put your signature, at the appropriate place.
- ∞ Malpractice in any form is an offence. If you are found guilty, law would take its course.
- ∞ Don't walk along the corridors or loiter in the campus, during the examinations.
- ∞ Hand over your answer papers, securely fastened, to the Invigilator. Leave the hall only when directed to do so, by the invigilator.
- ∞ Scrupulously follow the instructions of the Principal, Chief Superintendent of the Examinations, Controller of Examinations and the Invigilator. Discipline is your ornament.
- ∞ If you follow these instructions, you are the topper!

QUESTION PAPER PATTERN

The general pattern for the question paper (theory) for the Semester Examinations:

SECTION - A

Question Nos 1 to 20, Multiple Choice Questions, each question having four answers under the choice. **20 x 1 = 20 Marks**

SECTION - B

Question Nos. 21 to 25, Answer any one of the two Questions, under each subdivision. (Either ... Or ... pattern) **5 x 5 = 25 Marks**

SECTION - C

Question Nos. 26 to 30 Internal Choice Questions (Three out of Five Questions) **3 x 10 = 30 Marks**

This pattern is subject to change, depending upon the needs of the Courses or Programmes. The students are advised to consult the Faculty member and/or the Head of the Department.

EVALUATION OF INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

The Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA), is based on the performance of the student in the Assignment, Tests, Seminars and Attendance, every semester. This score is coupled with the Semester Examinations, to decide the percentage of marks secured by the student. This can be converted into the grade points. The Course Teacher evaluates the performance. This evaluation is consolidated at the end of the course. The components for the CIA are:

PASSING MINIMUM

UNDER GRADUATE

The passing minimum for CIA and end semester examination, shall be 40%, individually and as aggregate.

POST GRADUATE

A candidate shall be declared to have passed in each course, if he/she secures not less than 40% marks in the end semester examinations and 40% marks in the CIA and not less than 50% in the aggregate.

SUPPLEMENTARY EXAMINATIONS

These examinations are conducted at the end of the final semester within 15 days of the declaration of the results for those out-going students with an arrear in only one course.

IMPROVEMENT OF INTERNAL ASSESSMENT MARKS

The students, who fail to attend the CIA Test or submit the assignment, are permitted to write the Test/Assignment, before finalising the CIA marks, during the semester, at the discretion of the Principal. The dates of the tests are decided by the concerned Head of the Department, in consultation with the tutor and the staff-in-charge of the respective course.

The students who fail to secure the passing minimum in the CIA of a course, may be permitted only once, to improve the Internal Assessment in the subsequent semesters by writing three assignments and two tests, by remitting a fee of Rs.500/- per course.

In case of PG. Students, those who have secured a passing minimum of 40% in both the CIA and end semester examinations, but failed to secure 50% in aggregate, are considered as failed candidates. Such students are not permitted to improve CIA. However, he/she can only appear for the theory examination in the subsequent semesters to secure the minimum pass of 50% in the aggregate.

TRANSPARENCY, RE-TOTALING AND REVALUATION

There is a provision for obtaining transparency (photocopy) of the answer scripts by remitting a fee of Rs.300/- per course. A student may also opt for re-totaling of his/her answer scripts by remitting a fee of Rs.300/- per course

A Student may also apply for revaluation of the answer scripts by remitting a fee of Rs.500/- per course. However, in the process of revaluation, the answer scripts for the course concerned may not be revalued directly. Rather, the transparency of the answer scripts for the applied course, would be scrutinised for its essentiality before revaluation.

IMPROVEMENT OF MARKS

The college permits the students willing to improve their marks/grade points by appearing for the subsequent end semester examinations, if he/she does not have any arrear till that semester (in which he wants to apply for improvement). A fee of Rs.500/- is to be paid for each course. The candidate is to specify the course/courses, which he desires to improve, separately, while applying for improvement. The college gives only one chance for such improvement. This provision is given only to facilitate the student to improve the grade point average. And they are not eligible for appearing in the Ranking Examinations conducted by the college and the university.

RANKING SYSTEM

The Rank Certificates for the first rank holders, are issued for every Programme under the Autonomous Stream. The candidate must have passed the examinations in the first attempt in the prescribed duration of the programme and should not have absented himself for any of the courses (for absence is considered as an attempt). The Bharathidasan University too conducts Ranking Examinations (URE) for the toppers in every programme. The first rank holders of all the autonomous colleges and the top 20 rank holders of the non- autonomous colleges are eligible to sit for the examination conducted by the University. The toppers are the University Rank Holders, irrespective of the grades they have obtained in the end-semester examinations.

REVISION OF REGULATIONS AND CURRICULUM

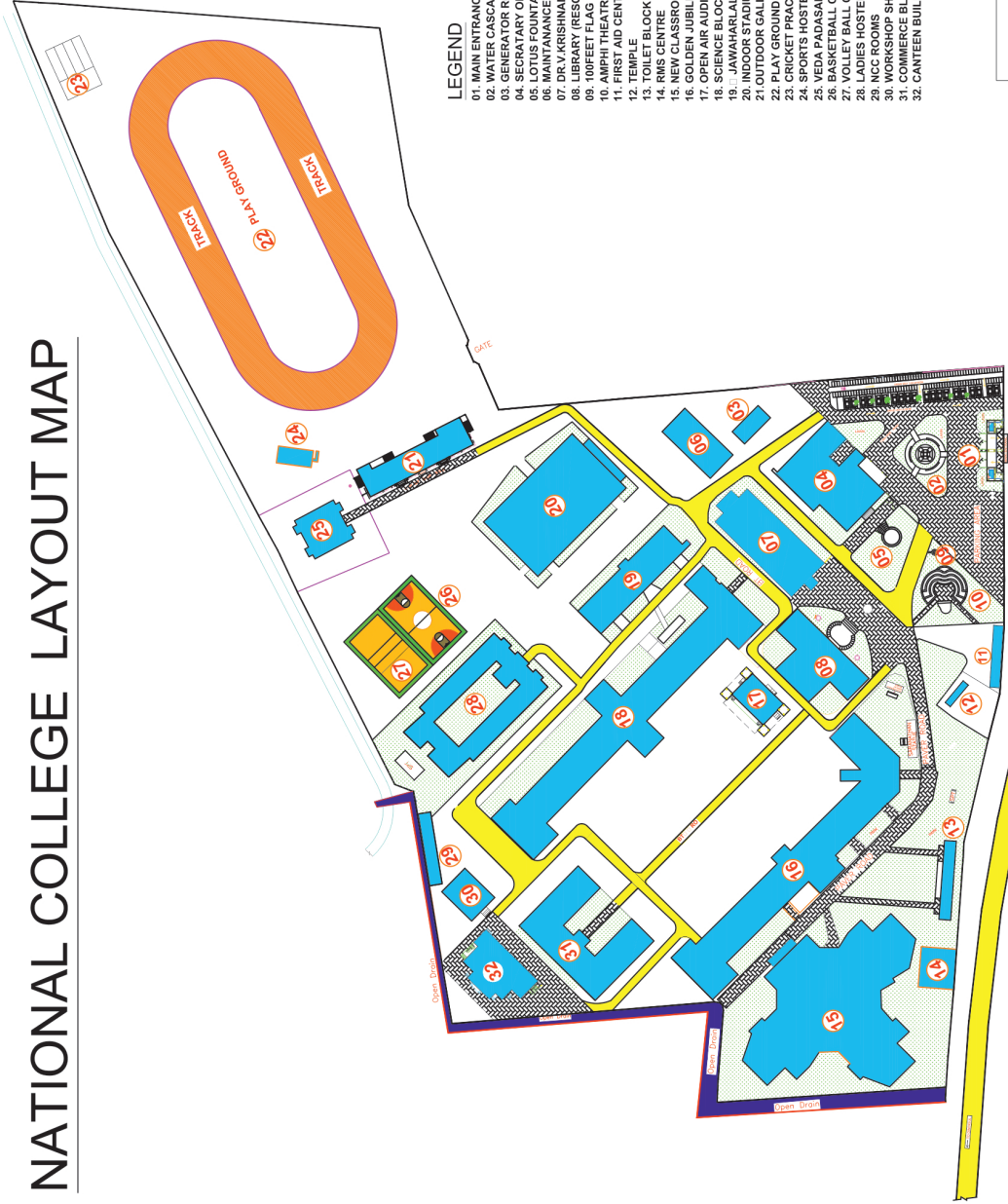
